# 3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR C - 15th December 2024 Gaudete Sunday

Our journey through advent continues and find ourselves today at the third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word that means "rejoice." This name is taken from the entrance antiphon for Sunday's Mass "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near. These same words are echoed in today's second reading from the Paul's letter to the Philippians. To mark the occasion, this Sunday we are lighting the rose coloured candle instead of a purple one on our Advent wreath, and wearing the rose coloured vestment, instead of the purple one. It is a reminder that the Advent season is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand.

When we talk about Joy, it is far more than just a sense of "feeling good" or pleased. It's not like a drink that makes us happy, or some activity that takes our minds of things, this kind of joy or happiness is

fleeting. The sense of joy that the gospel invites us to experience requires work and fortitude, because it calls on us to learn to detach ourselves from whatever is holding us back from meeting our Lord. Advent is about waiting, sharing, and joy. In the Gospel today, the people came to John and asked him what they must do and John implores them to share what they have with those who have not, that they should be fair in their dealings with others and not seek to take advantage of others and to not use the power one may have over another for personal gain. Instead we are called to share what we have as we wait for the one who is coming and in doing so experience the Joy that only Christ can give.

The Joy we are called to is that which allows us to stand tall in times of sorrow, for we know what is to come. The Prophet Zephaniah in our first reading calls to the people to shout for Joy, not because everything was perfect in his time, the majority of Zephaniah writing had to do with the Judgement that was to come to Judah and Jerusalem, and yet with hope he called on the people to rejoice because "The Lord, the king of Israel is in your midst; you have no evil to fear." So while we wait, let us make this time the most joyful experience of our faith by detaching ourselves from what holds us back from being fully joyful.



#### THE FOUR WEEKS OF ADVENT

During the first two weeks of Advent we light the first two purple candles. The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. On this day we celebrate that our waiting for the birth of Jesus on Christmas day is almost over. Rose is a liturgical colour that is used to signify joy, so we light the single pink candle on the third Sunday of Advent. Then on the fourth Sunday of Advent, the final purple candle is lit to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait expectantly for the soon-coming birth of the King of Kings.

Traditionally, each of the four Advent candles have a deeper meaning which is depicted in the lovely Four Weeks of Advent Pewter Wreath:

The 1st Sunday of Advent symbolizes Hope with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.

The 2nd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

The 3rd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Joy with the "Shepherd's Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.

The 4th Sunday of Advent symbolizes Peace with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."
