22ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 1st September 2024 FATHERS DAY AND SAFEGUARDING SUNDAY

I'm sure at some point in life each of us has heard or been told, that it isn't how something or someone looks on the outside but it is what is inside that counts. The real beauty of something, especially a person is found on the inside. Wise words and in today's Gospel we have a similar message, though with a little bit of a twist.

The Gospel starts with the Pharisees and scribes once again trying to find fault with Jesus, and today they have noticed that some of his disciples are eating with unclean hands, not washing them first. The washing of ones hands up till the elbows and sprinkling oneself with water were a couple of the many traditions that had arisen over time, they were not part of God's law, but as can happen with traditions they had started to be treated as such.

Given what we know of germs today the washing of ones hands before eating is not a bad idea, but this is not why the Pharisees are annoyed with Jesus, instead it is an issue of why aren't you acting like we do, following the same traditions we do! And Jesus calls them out, calling them hypocrites. Accusing them of doing the very thing we are warned not to do in our first reading, when Moses tells the people of Israel that they must add nothing and take nothing from the commandments that God gives, but to keep to them. Unfortunately, the Pharisees are so focused on how they are viewed, that they appear holy to the people and to be seen to follow all the right rules and traditions. Unaware that it is what is inside a person that counts, for as they strive to appear clean on the outside, they are unaware what is going on inside where evil intent can often grow? And before we think it is just the Pharisees who are wrong, even the disciples at times became victims to pride and envy as they journeyed with Jesus.

If even the disciples can fall victim what hope do we have? Our second reading gives us some sound advice "Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. But you must do what the word tells you, and not just listen to it and deceive yourselves." Let us always be aware of our own hearts, but allow the Word of God and not our own desires or how the world views us guide it.



Blessed Carlo Acutis died from leukemia in 2006 when he was just 15 years old. Carlo had a deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist and used his passion for technology to create a website that documented approved Eucharistic miracles. He once described the Eucharist as "the highway to heaven". Carlo was beatified in 2020 and is currently in the process of becoming a canonised saint. He is a role model for young people around the world, drawing many deeper into their Catholic faith.

CATHEDRAL RESTORATION WORK UPDATE

St Mary's Cathedral has been undergoing significant work schedule for the past months and are ongoing.

The Cathedral Baptistery works include removal of existing solid plaster effected by rising damp, treatment to walls for removal of salt within the sandstone block, hoarding to be installed, removal of copper screening, install new solid plaster, install floor framing and lay new decorative timber floor.

The Nun's Chapel works include removal of portioning wall and canopy structure, removal of existing wall to Nun's Chapel, installation of new Parclose Screen with glass templates above parclose screen and new furnishings.

READINGS OF THE DAY – 22ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Deuteronomy 4:1-2. 6-8

Moses said to the people: 'Now, Israel, take notice of the laws and customs that I teach you today, and observe them, that you may have life and may enter and take possession of the land that the Lord the God of your fathers is giving you. You must add nothing to what I command you, and take nothing from it, but keep the commandments of the Lord your God just as I lay them down for you. Keep them, observe them, and they will demonstrate to the peoples your wisdom and understanding. When they come to know of all these laws they will exclaim, "No other people is as wise and prudent as this great nation." And indeed, what great nation is there that has its gods so near as the Lord our God is to us whenever we call to him? And what great nation is there that has laws and customs to match this whole Law that I put before you today?'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 14:2-5. R. v.1

(R.) The just will live in the presence of the Lord.

- Lord, who shall dwell on your holy mountain?
 He who walks without fault;
 he who acts with justice
 and speaks the truth from his heart. (R.)

Second Reading <u>James 1:17-18, 21-22, 27</u>

It is all that is good, everything that is perfect, which is given us from above; it comes down from the Father of all light; with him there is no such thing as alteration, no shadow of a change. By his own choice he made us his children by the message of the truth so that we should be a sort of first-fruits of all that he had created. Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. But you must do what the word tells you, and not just listen to it and deceive yourselves. Pure, unspoilt religion, in the eyes of God our Father is this: coming to the help of orphans and widows when they need it, and keeping oneself uncontaminated by the world.

Gospel Acclamation James 1:18

Alleluia, alleluia!

The Father gave us birth by his message of truth, that we might be as the first fruits of his creation. **Alleluia!**

Gospel Mark 7:1-8. 14-15. 21-23

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'
