OUR DAILY BREAD.

Jesus had just received the sad news of John the Baptist execution and in the company of his disciples he began to journey to a quiet place where they could be alone but we are told in today's Gospel that a large crowd followed them around the sea of Galilee because of their curiosity wanting to see and hear more from Jesus. He had worked many miracles among them and they were impressed by the signs he gave curing the sick and raising the dead. Jesus had felt pity on the large crowd and engaged the disciples in ministering to their needs. "Where can we find some bread for these people to eat?" When we reflect on this question, what is Jesus saving to us today? What can I do to relieve the sufferings of the people of our time who are deprived of so much? Prayer in action! While we can look at the physical needs of our neighbour, what about the spiritual needs? The elements which are contained in this Gospel narrative reflect the celebration of the Mass. We gather prayerfully as one family in Christ before the entrance of the Priest who through the Word, prayers of the Mass and the distribution of the Holy Eucharist unites us as one in Christ who continues to forgive, love and nourish us through our journey of life here on earth and on into the glory of Eternal life united forever with God who first gives life.

(Jn 6: 32-33) 'I tell you most solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gave you the bread from heaven, the true bread, for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

Today, 27 young parishioners will be journeying together as they continue their sacramental preparation towards their first reception of the real presence of Jesus Christ in Holy Communion. This joyful event will complete their reception of the three sacraments of initiation into a life of lived faith in the Catholic Church namely Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion (Eucharist). By the grace of God they are marked (as we are through our Baptism) as members of the Mystical Body of Christ called to proclaim the Kingdom of God in the world of our time by word and active ministry, Let us pray for these children, their families and our parishioners; including our priests who share their lived faith life with us. May we continue to support each other in prayer and in deed. With gratitude to God we can ask again, "Give us this day our daily bread" Amen.




NATIONAL AWARENESS WEEK FOR VOCATIONS

BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS RELIC TOUR & EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES EXHIBITION:

20 July - 1 September

A first-class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian teenager soon to be canonised, will be visiting Tasmania from 20 July to 1 September, along with an international exhibition he designed featuring Eucharistic miracles from around the world. The relic and exhibition will visit parishes and schools across the whole of Tasmania. There will be opportunities at each location to venerate the relic and to visit the exhibition.

Who is Bl. Carlo Acutis?

Blessed Carlo Acutis died from leukemia in 2006 when he was just 15 years old. Carlo had a deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist and used his passion for technology to create a website that documented approved Eucharistic miracles. He once described the Eucharist as "the highway to heaven". Carlo was beatified in 2020 and is currently in the process of becoming a canonised saint. He is a role model for young people around the world, drawing many deeper into their Catholic faith.

READINGS OF THE DAY - 17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading 2 Kings 4:42-44.

A man came from Baal-shalishah, bringing Elisha, the man of God, bread from the first-fruits, twenty barley loaves and fresh grain in the ear. 'Give it to the people to eat,' Elisha said. But his servant replied, 'How can I serve this to a hundred men?' 'Give it to the people to eat' he insisted 'for the Lord says this, "They will eat and have some left over."' He served them; they ate and had some over, as the Lord had said.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 144:10-11, 15-18. R. v.16

(R.) The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs.

- All your creatures shall thank you, O Lord, and your friends shall repeat their blessing. They shall speak of the glory of your reign and declare your might, O God. (R.)
- The eyes of all creatures look to you and you give them their food in due time.
 You open wide your hand, grant the desires of all who live. (R.)
- The Lord is just in all his ways and loving in all his deeds.

Second Reading Ephesians 4:1-6

I, the prisoner in the Lord, implore you to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same hope when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is Father of all, through all and within all.

A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people.

Gospel John 6:1-15

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
