28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 13th September 2024

In the letter to the Hebrews which we hear at Mass today there is a reminder to the readers of the letter that the Word of God is something alive and active, and this is just as true today as it was 2000 ish years ago. The word of God is the living word and speaks to us today as it has throughout history, even though the words don't change and our culture does, the message of hope, faith and love remain the same, the world around us may change but the word of God doesn't, in fact one of the great miracles is that the word of God doesn't change, but it has the ability to transform us, and the stories of the saints are filled with everyday people like you and me, who upon hearing and reading the word of God went on to do great things, not for themselves but for the glory of God.

Today we hear in the Gospel of the rich man who asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus of course directs him to the commandments and the rich man is quick to reply that he has kept the commandment from his earliest days. And there are many in the world today who might make the same claim, I live a good life, I don't kill or cheat or lie or steal, the Lord looked at the rich man and loved him, a line which is unique to the account of this story in Mark, and we know he looks at us with love, but the Lord calls us to more, just as he did the rich man to go the next step. "Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Sadly the rich man is unable to, as we are told because he was a man of great wealth.

Remember this is the living word of God and so it is speaking to us today, and you might think, I don't have great wealth so I'm good to go, but the call from the Lord to follow him is universal and we are called to give up anything that might hold us back from answering that call, for the Rich Man it was his great wealth, for us it might be our phones or a hobby or it might be an addiction and that might seem almost impossible to leave behind, thankfully we are reminded that for men it is impossible but for God all things are possible.

Let us follow the words from our first reading "I prayed, and understanding was given me; I entreated, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me."





ARCHDIOCESE OF HOBART SAFE COMMUNITIES TRAINING FOR CURRENT AND NEW PARISH VOLUNTEERS





at her hands riches not to be numbered.


Responsorial Psalm Ps 89:12-17. R. v.14

Second Reading <u>Hebrews 4:12-13</u>

The word of God is something alive and active; it cuts like any double-edged sword but more finely: it can slip through the place where the soul is divided from the spirit, or joints from the marrow; it can judge the secret emotions and thoughts. No created thing can hide from him; everything is uncovered and open to the eyes of the one to whom we must give account of ourselves.

Gospel <u>Mark 10:17-30</u>

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'
