2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR C - 8th December 2024

As we enter the 2nd Sunday of Advent, the voice of John the Baptist resounds with urgency and hope: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight!" (Luke 3:4). John's proclamation invites us to look inward, clear the obstacles that prevent Christ from entering our lives, and make space for His transformative power.

Advent is not merely a waiting time but a season of active preparation. It calls us to repentance—not simply feeling sorry for our sins but consciously choosing to turn back to God. The Greek word for repentance, "metanoia", signifies a change of heart and direction, aligning our lives with God's will. John's baptism of repentance prepared people to receive the Messiah, and today, we are invited to undergo a similar renewal. Luke situates John's mission within the political and religious context of his time, naming rulers and leaders who foreshadow the challenges Jesus would face. Yet, amidst this backdrop, John's message offers hope: the promise of salvation foretold by Isaiah, where "every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low" (Isaiah 40:4). This vivid imagery reassures us that no obstacle is too great for God's grace. The mountains of pride, anger, and selfishness in our hearts can be levelled, and the valleys of despair, fear, and doubt can be filled with hope and

The first reading from the prophet Baruch builds on this theme, calling God's people to put aside their mourning and wear the joy of salvation. Addressed to exiled Jews, Baruch's words resonate today in our struggles—whether personal, relational, or societal. His vision of renewal, where God leads His people with mercy and justice, invites us to place our trust in Him and walk forward in hope.

Advent challenges us to ask: What valleys in our hearts need to be filled with trust and faith? What mountains of resentment or pride need to be brought low? What crooked paths need straightening so Christ can fully enter our lives? These questions require action. Forgiving someone, reconciling with a loved one, or extending kindness to a stranger—such acts of love pave the way for the Lord.

This season is a time to shed burdens and embrace the freedom of walking in God's light.

As we prepare for Christmas, let us heed John the Baptist's call to repentance and transformation. May we welcome Christ, not just as the child of Bethlehem but as the Lord of our lives, with renewed hearts and faith-filled actions.





READINGS OF THE DAY – 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR C

First Reading Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Alleluia, alleluia! Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 125: R. v.3

- (R.) The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.
- When the Lord delivered Zion from bondage, 1. it seemed like a dream. Then was our mouth filled with laughter, on our lips there were songs. (R.)
- 2. The heathens themselves said: 'What marvels the Lord worked for them!' What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad. (R.)
- Deliver us, O Lord, from our bondage 3. as streams in dry land. Those who are sowing in tears will sing when they reap. (R.)

Second Reading Philippians 1:3-6,8-11

Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present. I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss

you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
