5TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME YEAR C - 9th FEBRUARY 2025

In the Church we use the word Vocation, from the Latin *Vocare* meaning 'to call'. And we speak of different vocations in the Church, a call to priesthood and to the diaconate, a call to religious life, married life or dedicated single life.

We as Christian's are all called to holiness as our primary vocation, but in our lives we may feel God calling us to a specific vocation. Sometimes though we may feel God is wrong in what he is calling us to, "God must be wrong, I can't be a priest, look at my flaws" or "I don't believe married life is for me, I need my own space." To this I would remind others that God doesn't call the qualified, but instead he qualifies the called, and our readings today provide a great example of this.

In the gospel today Simon Peter falls to his knees before Jesus saying "Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.", In our first reading Isiah professes "What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips". And finally in our second reading Paul declares himself the least of the apostles, stating that since he persecuted the Church of God, he hardly deserved the name of apostle. And yet Simon, Paul and Isiah share something important in common, they were chosen by God.

Isiah states he is lost and unclean but God purges his iniquity preparing him and Isiah responds to God's call "Here I am, send me." Isiah would prepare the people for the coming of the Lord by foretelling the Messiah, the suffering servant and bringing hope to God's people. Paul tells how Jesus, the Risen Lord appeared to him, though he was not worthy by the Grace of God, he was able to answer the call. Paul by the grace of God would share the Gospel with the gentiles, one of those very gentiles being Saint Luke whose Gospel we read today at Mass. In our reading today from the Gospel of Luke we find Peter who states he is a sinful man, Jesus does not send him away but instead calls him to a great responsibility, to be a fisher of men. And it will be on that flawed fisherman, that rock, on which Jesus will build his Church.

In each of our readings today we find those who are imperfect, being called, no longer are their lives about themselves but they are called to service of others, to love of others. Are you hearing Jesus call you? If so don't be so quick to dismiss the call because you believe you are not up to the task or it would not fit in with your plans.

I would implore you to instead to take it to prayer, to discern, and not to be afraid to follow the example of Isiah, and answer our Lord "Here I am, send me".

READINGS OF THE DAY – 5TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

First Reading Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings. And they cried out to one another in this way, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.' The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said: 'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said: 'See now, this has touched your Gospel lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged.' Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?' I answered, 'Here I am, send me.'

(R.) In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.

Second Reading <u>1 Corinthians 15:1-11</u>

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything. Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

Luke 5:1-11

Jesus was standing one day by the lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point. When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.
