



READINGS OF THE DAY - FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR B

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything.

we shall receive,

because we keep his commandments

and live the kind of life that he wants.

His commandments are these:

that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ

and that we love one another

as he told us to.

Whoever keeps his commandments

lives in God and God lives in him.

We know that he lives in us

by the Spirit that he has given us.

ALL WHO LIVE IN ME, AND I IN THEM, BEAR MUCH FRUIT

What is Jesus saying to us today in the liturgy of the word? Are we being asked to look at ourselves regarding our relationship with our loving God who has given us the free gift of life and to value the relationship we have with those around us?. Through the sacrament of Baptism we are united as one in Jesus Christ through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit who lives and acts in us as we grow to know, love and serve God in each other.

Jesus says, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit because apart from me you can do nothing." The fruit referred to in the saying by Jesus is the holiness of our lives when we are in union with Jesus. When we believe in Christ and follow the commandments, Jesus comes to dwell in and through us as we grow together in love of God and love one another. The Spirit dwells in us directing all we say and do as true disciples bringing the Good News for a broken world. We know the first three commandments are about the worship, love, respect and honour which is due to God who loves us unconditionally. The other seven commandments relate to our respect, acceptance, forgiveness, and love of our neighbour. Jesus ,the greatest of all teachers says of himself; "I am the vine, I am the bread of life;

I am the light of the world, I am the gate, I am the way, the truth and the life, I am He. (the Son of God.) I am the Resurrection; Apart from me you can do nothing". When we are as one in the Holy Spirit 'nothing' is turned into 'something' because we cannot say 'no' but 'yes' if we are a branch on the vine acting through the movement of the Holy Spirit living in us. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created and you shall renew the face of the earth. Amen



For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honour Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, but the entire month. The ways Mary is honoured in May is as varied as the people who honour her. If we recite rosary every day, it helps creating a special relationship with the Virgin Mary and makes us feel closer to her and Jesus. Furthermore, reciting the Rosary each day of the month guarantees blessings and benefits for our beloved ones and our families. Also, by reciting it, we can alleviate the pains suffered by the souls in the Purgatory.

It's common for parishes to have a daily recitation of the Rosary during May, and many erect a special May altar with a statue or picture of Mary as a reminder of Mary's month. Additionally, it's a long-standing tradition to crown the statue of Mary during May – a custom known as May Crowning. Often, the crown is made of beautiful blossoms

But May altars and crowning aren't just "church" customs. We can and should be doing the same in our homes. When we echo the customs and traditions of the Church in our homes – our domestic churches – we participate more fully in the life of the Church.

Devotion to Mary is one an important part of the Catholic identity. As our mother she is an example of a committed "Yes" (Fiat) to the will of God. Because of the devotion to her many people ask her for help in the most difficult moments of their life as any child does with his mother.
