32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 10th November 2024

SHE GAVE ALL SHE HAD.

Throughout the Gospel of St. Mark these last few weeks we have been given much food for reflection and prayer regarding discipleship and service for the sake of the Kingdom of God the bases of which is, Love of God and Love of neighbour. (Jn 13:v34.) Remember the young man who wanted to know what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus replied, "sell everything you own - give the money to the poor then come follow me." Could the young man really put others' needs first before his own needs and follow Jesus? St Francis of Assisi did exactly this. Can we do the same? James and John were somewhat confused about the establishment of the Kingdom of God! God has no favourites, salvation is for all. The Kingdom of God is not about position, power, possessions, prestige or wealth but about LOVE IN ACTION. Jesus gave his all for us. Blind Bartimaeus wanted to see again. The conversation between himself and Jesus is worth taking time to reflect upon. Bartimaeus called from the crowd, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped. "Call him here". The crowd called out. "Courage, they said, get up, he is calling you." Jesus asked, "What is it you want me to do for you." "Master, Let me see again." Jesus said, "Go, your faith has saved you."

In today's Gospel can you visualize Jesus sitting in the midst of the crowds in the Temple watching people come and go as the wealthy put large amounts of money into the treasury and then notice the poor widow put all she had as her offering. Jesus made a point telling his disciples that the poor widow put in more than the others because she had given ALL she had. Is this an example for us to follow? Is this an example of true discipleship? Do we too love each other as God loves us.? Can we give our all? What does this mean for me/you? The poor widow gave not only all she had but her whole life as well. I invite you to pray the beautiful psalm for today's liturgy daily this coming week.

' It is the Lord who keeps faith forever.'




ANNUAL PRIEST RETREAT

Red Wednesday is an initiative of *Aid to the Church in Need* (ACN) to pray for, and draw attention to, Christians who suffer and are persecuted for their faith. Since 2018, ACN Australia has joined commemorations around the world for Red Wednesday. READINGS OF THE DAY – 32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading 2 Kings 17:10-16

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said, 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives', she replied, 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent,
jug of oil shall not be emptied,
before the day when the Lord sends
rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate
the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was
not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord

had foretold through Elijah.

- It is the Lord who keeps faith forever who is just to those who are oppressed.
 It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord who sets prisoners free. (R.)
- 2. It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down. It is the Lord who loves the just, the Lord who protects the stranger. (R.)
- The Lord upholds the widow and orphan but thwarts the path of the wicked.
 The Lord will reign for ever,

Second Reading <u>Hebrews 9:24-28</u>

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to

suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

Gospel Mark 12:38-44

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.' He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called to his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'
