23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 8th September 2024

BE OPEN TO THE WORD

We see in the Gospel today the humanity and divinity of Jesus once again as he chooses to heal the man who could not hear or speak. At the centre of our faith is Jesus Christ, God in human flesh living among us today through the presence of the Holy Spirit. Let the actions of Jesus speak to our hearts and renew our trust in the salvation of the world because of Jesus' self sacrifice. Jesus cured many people bringing health to the sick and to give pardon to the sinner. How does this scene of the healing of the deaf mute speak personally to each of us.? Does the scene touch our hearts? "Ephphatha; be opened'? How can I speak and live the word of God to those I meet.? God chose the poor but rich in faith as heirs to the Kingdom of God (Mk:7.v37) 'He even causes the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak.

'(Hymn no. 582 CWB.2)

- 1. Open my eyes, Lord. Help me to see your face.
- 2. Open my ears, Lord Help me to hear your voice.
- 3. Open my heart, Lord help me to love like you. (Open my mouth, Lord Help me to speak your words.)
- 4. I live within you, deep in your heart, O Love.
- 5. I live within you. Rest now in me. This hymn is so appropriate for today's liturgy and for our own reflection and prayer during the coming week. ' Praise the Lord my soul'. We often hear the expression, God has been so good to me/ us, and so God is good. We recall and give thanks to God for the anniversary of four of our priests; Archbishop Julian, Fr. Mark, Fr. Suresh, and Fr. Guy. We are grateful to them for their continual dedication to their priestly ministry. (ccc.1546) 'Christ, high priest and unique mediator, has made the Church; a kingdom of priests for his Father.' The whole community of believers, is as such, priestly. As we minister to one another we too are graced because of the sacrament of Baptism, as priest, prophet and king announcing the presence of God by word and action following the promptings of the Holy Spirit . Let us pray especially for our jubilarians and support our priests. May their hearts be filled with peace, love, joy and satisfaction as vessels of God's mercy and love hearing Jesus saying "Well done, good and faithful disciples."

We are especially blessed today because members of the Legion of Mary are present celebrating 90 years of dedication to the poor and powerless both materially and spiritually. We thank them for their ministry and wish them every blessing as they continue to respond to the voice of the Holy Spirit. May the word of God be always on their lips: on our lips and in our hearts.






IN THE DIOCESE



READINGS OF THE DAY – 23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Isaiah 35:4-7

Say to all faint hearts,
'Courage! Do not be afraid.
'Look, your God is coming,
vengeance is coming,
the retribution of God;
he is coming to save you.'
Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened,
the ears of the deaf unsealed,
then the lame shall leap like a deer
and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy;
for water gushes in the desert,
streams in the wasteland,
the scorched earth becomes a lake,
the parched land springs of water.

Second Reading James 2:1-5

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your

mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel Mark 7:31-37

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
