12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 23rd June 2024

As we are heading this pilgrim journey, we have stepped into the 12th Sunday in Ordinary time emphasizing the themes of seeking God's presence and protection during the storms of life.

The first reading is taken from the wisdom literature of Job 38:1,8-11 and conveys that the Lord tells Job how he set boundaries for the sea, controlling its limits and waves.

The second reading is taken from 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 and demonstrates that Christ's love leads us to live for him, not for ourselves. In Christ, we become a new creation, leaving the old behind.

The Holy Gospel is taken from the Markan version from 4:35-41 depicts the incident where Jesus calms the storm after his disciple wakes him in fear. He questions their faith, and they are amazed that even the wind and sea obey him.

Dear Friends, Sometimes God isolates you before he elevates you. Perhaps you might be thinking that everything is falling apart, but everything is falling into place. True miracles won't give what you want, they are those that succeed in giving what you need when you neither wanted it nor asked for it until you realize that you've received it because you needed it the most but weren't wise enough to ask for it. Always remember if God brought you to it, He would bring you through it. When God is all, you have, you'll realize God is all you need. Think about how far you've come since that situation you thought would break you. You are here today. you have a purpose. God loves you REMEMBER that.

Believe that God is working in your life, right now, in ways you cannot understand. All it takes is one prayer to change everything. Hence stay faithful like Job. God can change things in a moment. Keep praying and never stop believing.

Let this be our prayer today!

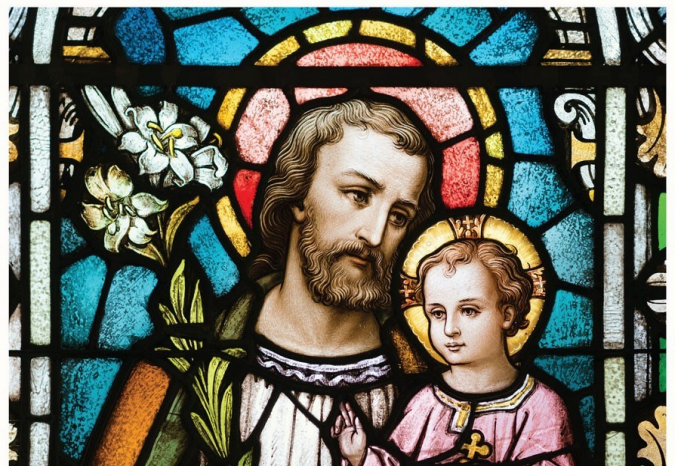

READINGS OF THE DAY – 12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Job 38:1. 8-11

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said: Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 106:23-26. 28-31. R. v.1

(R.) Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting.

1. Some sailed to the sea in ships to trade on the mighty waters. These men have seen the Lord's deeds, the wonders he does in the deep. (R.)
2. For he spoke; he summoned the gale, tossing the waves of the sea up to heaven and back into the deep; their soul melted away in their distress. (R.)
3. Then they cried to the Lord in their need and he rescued them from their distress. He stilled the storm to a whisper: all the waves of the sea were hushed. (R.)
4. They rejoiced because of the calm and he led them to the haven they desired. Let them thank the Lord for his love, the wonders he does for men. (R.)

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:14-17

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them. From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

A great prophet has appeared among us;
God has visited his people.
Alleluia!

Gospel Mark 4:35-41

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'
