PENTECOST SUNDAY - 19th May 2024

Silence can be a good thing, especially in a world where there is constant noise, constant voices. Whether it be the TV, the Radio, or Online Media. We are constantly being told what to think, what to believe, what to say, and what is true.

Sometimes we need to stop. Find a place of solitude and silence and listen to God, because if we truly want to hear "truth" why not go to the source.

In the Gospel today Jesus tells his disciples that the Advocate, the Spirit of Truth will lead them to complete truth, because he doesn't speak from himself, but speaks from the Father, this truth is not subjective, it doesn't change with the times, or with the whims of popular culture, it comes from the Father and so is eternal.

Paul in his letter to the Galatians warns against self-indulgence, and in a world that has become more focused on the self and more concerned with one's own truth, its hard not to see the actions that Paul warned against becoming more commonplace. Even in our Church, the One Catholic (Universal) Church, we see disagreements, factions, envy and jealousy, because to often we become more concerned with ourselves. But Paul also gives us the solution, to allow ourselves to be guided by the Spirit, and to allow its fruits to grow and prosper, in a world that so often can seem cruel, impatient, rushed, cold and unloving. The fruits of the spirit are sorely needed, and God gifts them to us freely, we just need to be willing to make a sacrifice. As Paul wrote "You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desires".

When we give of ourselves, we create a little more room for the spirit to grow. So when we find that moment of silence with God, let us not be afraid to pray "Lord send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth". Let us not be afraid to let the Holy Spirit into our lives, to listen to it, and to be open to the change it will bring.

Of course there is a next step, Jesus calls the Spirit his witness and tells the disciples they are to be his witnesses as well. We are to be the same, when we open ourselves to the Truth from the Holy Spirit and we experience the gifts it brings in our own lives, we must be like the disciples and go forth and preach about the marvels of God.





READINGS OF THE DAY - PENTECOST SUNDAY

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 103:1. 24. 29-31. 34. R. v.30.

(R.) Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

- 1. Bless the Lord, my soul! Lord God, how great you are, How many are your works, O Lord! The earth is full of your riches. (R.)
- 2. You take back your spirit, they die, returning to the dust from which they came. You send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the earth. (R.)
- 3. May the glory of the Lord last for ever! May the Lord rejoice in his works! May my thoughts be pleasing to him. I find my joy in the Lord. (R.)

Second Reading Galatians 5:16-25.

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire.

Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'
