27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 6th October 2024

As we resume our pilgrimage as one holy Catholic Church, we are stepping into the 27th Sunday in ordinary time. This Sunday Church emphasizes the sacredness of the sacrament of holy matrimony and its beauty, and profoundness. The first reading for today comes from Genesis 2:18-24, where God created animals and birds for man to name, but none were suitable. God then created a woman from a man's rib. The man recognized her as his equal and partner. Hebrews 2:9–11, the second reading, reveals that God descended below the angels to experience death on behalf of everyone. By God's grace, he leads men to glory, becoming perfect through suffering and calling us "brothers." We extract the gospel from the Marken version 10:2-16, which depicts the incident where the Pharisees questioned Jesus about divorce, prompting him to emphasize God's original plan for marriage. He also welcomed children, stating the importance of receiving the kingdom of God like a child.

When we hear today's reading, the church wants us to focus on the church's fundamental belief about the sacrament of holy matrimony. There are a few insights that flow from today's readings: God creates a woman as a partner for man, demonstrating that marriage should be a union of equals. The unity is blessed by God.

The other idea revolves around the importance of family. Today, the Church emphasizes the teaching, that family is the basic unit of society, and it is the most important place where we find the love of Jesus and invites us to reflect on the importance of family life and the responsibility to nurture and care for family members.

The other notable theme is God's plan for marriage. Jesus himself clarifies that marriage is a sacred bond, emphasizing the importance of not breaking this bond lightly. However, today are we witnessing the absolute essence of marriage? The Innocence of Children: Jesus shows his unique concern for children and urges us to be childlike, trusting, and open to encountering God. Are we conscious of this? The most important thing that stands out today is Jesus' teaching on divorce. Our Lord himself addresses the issue of divorce, urging us to respect the commitment made in marriage. He invites fidelity and commitment in relationships. However, we observe that people today often take this for granted. Are we trying to criticize the church's stance, or are we trying to assimilate the virtue hidden in the truth?

Therefore, today is the best day to evaluate our own family lives. As Catholics, we must exemplify a heroic lifestyle brimming with virtue and truth. This is not an easy task, but it is up to you and me to practice it if we want to save our souls and enter the Kingdom of God. Being Catholic is easy, but practicing is difficult. The choice is up to you and me. Let this be our prayer today.




HOLY ROSARY



Lebanon since the launch of its Lebanon Crisis Appeal in May 2024. At that stage, the support primarily dealt with the impacts of the economic crisis, the provision of primary healthcare with special support for those with a disability and the elderly, as well as protection services for women facing gender-based violence.

Amid the new wave of displacement. Caritas partners are mobilising to provide emergency assistance, including:

- providing medical, food and hygiene support to a collective shelter.
- preparing emergency stock and warehouses.
- providing emotional and social support and cash for shelter for displaced and conflict-affected families.
- preparing partner centres to serve as shelters.
- distributing household and hygiene supplies to municipalities.
- preparing to distribute hot meals.

Kirsten Sayers, Interim CEO at Caritas Australia, said, "Our partners told us last year that the crisis is continual. When they think they have reached the bottom, it gets worse, with over 80% of people now living in poverty. This is not a population that can withstand a war and the displacement that it brings.

"Many people flee with nothing but the clothes on their backs. They face hunger, thirst and do not know where they will sleep. It is also a time when those already vulnerable women, children, the sick, elderly and disabled - become more vulnerable. They need information, food, blankets, medicine, water, and many other supplies.

"At Caritas we are holding our brothers and sisters in Lebanon in our hearts as we respond to that need."



READINGS OF THE DAY - 27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Genesis 2:18-24

The Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helpmate.' So from the soil the Lord God fashioned all the wild beasts and all the birds of heaven. These he brought to the man to see what he would call them, each one was to bear the name the man would give it. The man gave names to all Gospel the cattle, all the birds of heaven and all the wild beasts. But no helpmate suitable for man was found for him. So the Lord God made the man fall into a deep sleep. And while he slept, he took one of his ribs and enclosed it in flesh. The Lord God built the rib he had taken from the man into a woman, and brought her to the man. The man exclaimed:

'This at last is bone from my bones, and flesh from my flesh! This is to be called woman, for this was taken from man.' This is why a man leaves his father and mother and joins himself to his wife, and they become one body.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 127. R. v.5

May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives.

- 1. O blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways! By the labour of your hands you shall eat. You will be happy and prosper. (R.)

Second Reading Hebrews 2:9-11

We see in Jesus one who was for a short while made lower than the angels and is now crowned with glory and splendour because he submitted to death; by God's grace he had to experience death for all mankind. As it was his purpose to bring a great many of his sons into glory, it was appropriate that God, for whom everything exists and through whom everything exists, should make perfect, through suffering, the leader who would take them to their salvation. For the one who sanctifies, and the ones who are sanctified, are of the same stock; that is why he openly calls them brothers.

Alleluia, alleluia!

If we love one another, God will live in us in perfect love.

Mark 9:38-43. 45. 47-48

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.
