St Vincent de Paul Christmas Hamper **Update**

The Cathedral Conference of St Vincent de Paul would like to thank parishioners for their generous donations. We were able to assist 26 families/singles within our parish. The attached photo shows how much was collected and the excess was delivered to the Elizabeth St office/ shop. There is a pantry attached to the shop (set up on shelving, similar to the



supermarket) and Vinnies offer Emergency food relief to anyone who makes an appointment or walks in Monday to Friday. Our Parish Conference receives referrals and delivers assistance to the home on a weekly basis. We meet on Tuesday at 6pm and make our deliveries that evening. Volunteers always welcome to join.

Cathedral Restoration Works (6 January – 4 April 2025)

During the period 6 January – 4 April 2025 significant structural refurbishment of the Cathedral's organ/choir loft will be undertaken as part of the Cathedral's ongoing restoration program. The works schedule will present some unavoidable inconvenience to ensure completion by the commencement of Holy Week. Saturday evening and Sunday Masses will take place at the Cathedral as normal for the duration of the works. However, there will be no weekday Masses in the Cathedral between 6 January and 11 February 2025.

Notably also, the Cathedral's weekly livestream will not be available during this period. We appreciate your patience as we work to enhance the dignity of our extraordinary building and improve the facilities from where our choir works tirelessly each week to bring such beautiful sacred music to our liturgies.

- Walking cycling, using public transport more often.
- 5. Am I educating myself and others towards integral ecology to further my awareness and action?
