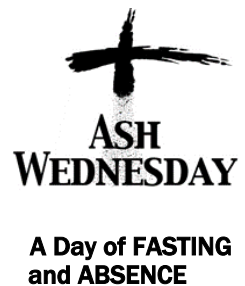

## Whole Parish Lenten Study on FORMED

Would you like to grow in your relationship with Jesus Christ? Do you know someone who has fallen away from the Church, perhaps a friend, a family member, or a co-worker, and you want reach them, but you just don't know how to?

This is why our parish has invested in **FORMED**—that each of us might grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ and be helped to share our faith with others, especially those closest to us. We want to invite you to participate in a program called FORGIVEN offered on **formed.org**.

With beautiful film-making and teaching on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, **FORGIVEN** will move your heart and give you plenty to discuss as a family or group of friends. The program will be 5 weeks in length, with an episode to watch each week. Formed can be accessed on smart phone, tablet, computer or smart TV.

Our Lenten Study can be undertaken at home using the formed website and can be done individually or in groups. This is a great opportunity to get together with family members or friends and go deeper into our faith together. There will be ample assistance for those who want to host a small group at home.

**It will also be run on Mondays, morning and evening, in the Cathedral Centre.**

## The power of bended knees

The first five books of the Old Testament (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy) are otherwise known as the Law. This is because they contain the laws and instructions of God given to the people of Israel through Moses. Today, our first reading is taken from Leviticus 13. Here, the people are instructed on how they must treat a leper. They are told that a leper must be isolated from other members of the community as long as he suffers from the disease. Clearly, this is to stop the disease from spreading around the entire community.

As a Jew, Jesus knew the Law of Moses, for Jewish people did not only hear the Law being read in the synagogue on the Sabbath day, but carried it in their hearts (Deuteronomy 4:9-10). Every Jew believed and revered the Law as the true word of God. It was the source and summit of their lives.

In today's gospel (Mark 1:40-45), we see two Jews (Jesus and the leper) who disrespect the law concerning leprosy. This leper does not isolate himself and Jesus does not rebuke him. Instead of isolating himself from the rest of the community, the



leper searches for Jesus on bended knees. On seeing the leper, Jesus sees not a law-breaker, but a desperate man. It is the leper's desperation that moves Jesus to heal him desperately. When we are truly desperate for God, God becomes desperate for us.

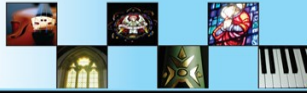
A Caritas representative will be giving a small presentation at the end of the Liturgy.
