#### I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE.

We are many parts - We are all one body.

May I invite you to recall a time when you witnessed a child's delight and reaction to a new discovery; maybe a flower, a rainbow or just watching a colony of ants or viewing a photo of the child as a baby.

I witnessed similar reactions in a young child who was observing tiny grains of wheat which were growing on damp cotton wool. Fine white roots and a green shoot were developing signifying life and growth.



The child's eyes were gleaming as he shouted out, "Look Sister, God is giving us a present, it's got life." - a future theologian; I thought, 'what more do I need to know.' Crushed wheat seeds become flour which in turn become a necessary ingredient for most cooking. (Thanks to all the present cake makers). Flour has become a Eucharistic symbol for me as my ancestors operated flour mills and some years ago, my Dad as a young man carted large bags of flour for Hammonds Company delivering them to the sales destination. I've often wondered how many crushed wheat seeds it takes to fill a kilo of flour. What has it become in order to satisfy human needs and hunger, in truth it is a gift.

The following refrain is from the hymn; 'We are many parts.' (No 834 Gather - blue book). 'We are many parts, we are all one body, and the gifts we have we are given to share. May the Spirit of love make us one indeed. One the love that we share, one our hope in despair, one the cross that we bear. God of all we look to you,' We are not only nourished by the humble presence of Jesus Christ in the consecrated bread and wine where He is our Host but equally and emphatically truly Jesus is present in the priest, the prayers spoken and the proclamation of the Word as in the scripture reading. Jesus is also present in each person gathered as the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ. How connected do you feel to Jesus and those present at Mass? Jesus said; "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Where and when does Jesus' presence affect my physical, emotional and spiritual life and growth? Jesus hungers and thirsts for us to know and love him and to serve him. Jesus promises eternal life with Him in Heaven. There may be times when we feel empty, alone, disappointed, vulnerable and depressed. This is part of our human condition. Our wants and needs can never be completely satisfied. It is through our genuine relationship with Jesus and those around us that we can be given renewed self-esteem "I am with you always; Jesus assures us. Let our faith and trust in Jesus' presence be real and active.

From St. Augustine: "Be what you are, and receive what you are. We not only receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, through the Eucharist, we are called to BE the Body of Christ because of what we have received and we receive the Body of Christ because we are already the Body of Christ," Praise be Jesus Christ true God and true Man.

## INVITATION FROM THE YOUTH GROUP FOR ADVENTURE SUNDAY




