31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 3rd November 2024

During the normal day to day life, discerning how God is calling us and what he is asking of us can be difficult and it is why we are encouraged to have a strong prayer life and to read the word of God, to participate in the Sacraments. By doing so we are at rest in the Lord, sustained and strengthen by him, as he walks alongside us and as a particular story about footprints in the sand goes, carrying us when needed. So what happens when the world gets turned upside down and we find ourselves traveling through chaotic times? As we are getting near the end of the year, naturally everything tends to grow more chaotic, certainly a little more hectic, as our lives become busier. Students preparing for the end of another school year, with exams and essays, and some even preparing to leave behind the school life they have known as they go on to further studies or enter the workforce. Parents and families as they are working out all the end of year activities and preparing for Christmas and the summer break, I doubt that anyone is spared the craziness that comes as we enter into the last two months of 2024.

Now more then ever it is important to keep ourselves connected to Christ through his word and sacraments. I also find it helps to have something to hold onto, the boat in the storm, and this weekend as Jesus answers a question for the scribe, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus not only gives an answer to the scribe but he gives us our answer as well, cause in the thick of things, in the chaotic moment and your wondering what is God calling me to do in this moment, we have a bar to check it by, does my action show love of God, does it show love of neighbour and does it show love for myself. Am I giving God all my heart, soul, mind and strength. When our intention is to love God, our actions will produce fruit, as Moses said to the people "Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase". It is by following the great commandment that we will have life and will come to Christ and are saved, so that we not only have life here and now, but will have eternal life to come.




THE CATHEDRAL PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING **HIGHLIGHTS**

The Pastoral Council met on Thursday 17th October and see outcomes of the meeting

- 1. The Sacramental Program was discussed with some feed back provided, which will be taken to our Sacramental Team and School Religious Education Coordinators in preparation for next years program.
- 2. It was discussed and agreed upon to change the Sacred Heart Mass time Monday - Thursday from 9am to 9:15am. This will help to provide a safer environment in the car park, and will ensure that classes are able to join us for Mass more often. We are hopeful this will be able to start in the new year. - 3. Times for Christmas Masses and Masses after Christmas were discussed and will be published in the AVE as we get closer to Christmas.
- 4. Our Schools were discussed, way in which we can strengthen the ties between Parish and Schools, schools are an Important element of our Catholic identity and Catholic Mission.
- 5. Volunteers were also discussed, we are so blessed to have the current volunteers that we have, but as Catholics we are all called to be active in the Church, and so it is important that all parishioners are encouraged to take up roles of service in the Church.

READINGS OF THE DAY – 31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God' Alleluia, alleluia! all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

Responsorial Psalm <u>Ps 17:2-4, 47, 51. R. v.2</u>

(R.) I love you Lord, my strength.

- 1. I love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour. My God is the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold. The Lord is worthy of all praise: when I call I am saved from my foes. (R.)
- 2. Long life to the Lord, my rock! Praised be to the God that saves me. He has given great victories to his king and shown love for his anointed. (R.)

Second Reading Hebrews 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Acclamation John 14:23

All who love me will keep my words, commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

Gospel Mark 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
